Donald E. Theobald, 78, of East Peoria, passed away peacefully on Monday, September 6, 2021, surrounded by his family at his home. He was born on March 3, 1943, in Peoria, to Ralph and Verla (Shew) Theobald. He married Bonnie Jo Cornwell on May 2, 1965, in East Peoria; she survives.
