The three of us were very competitive with each other. Terry was a little taller than I and during basketball practices or during recess at St. Pats he and I would battle hard for the rebound. It would take a couple of attempts between the two of us until one of us got the rebound. Fortunately, when we played against other teams of the diocesan league we were on the same team. He and I were very good athletes and very competitive towards each other. But neither of us would ever let the competitiveness between us to interfere with our friendship.

Winter time, we would have snowball fights with all of the neighborhood kids. We would build igloos and forts from the snow.

I lived on Martin street and his home on Kettle street shared the same alley. We would use the alley to walk or ride our bikes to the other's home. He lived two houses down from Proctor Center.
