Lela "Lee" Rule Riekert, age 98 of Washington, departed this life peacefully at 2:34 PM on Wednesday, May 6, 2020 at Unity Point Health Methodist in Peoria.

She was born September 29, 1921 in Noble, IL to John H. Rule and Inez Davis Rule. She married Robert G. Riekert on June 3, 1950 and he preceded her in death in August 2013.
